

2013-2014 Winter maintenance; Part 2 by John Schretlen

A couple of weeks later I had the parts and pretty soon the turn signal system worked normally.

Since I had the front of the bike taken apart I decided to put it back together before working on the next items. It took a day to put the dash back – the three bolts are very tricky to start and tighten. But it all went together and I was ready for the next item, which was the new handlebar cluster.

Nothing is easy or quick when it comes to wiring on a Honda. To do the handlebar cluster first I had to disconnect the throttle cables. I'm actually pleased because hiding under the throttle grip was some old Alaskan dust. In fact it looked and felt like the dust that we encountered between Chicken AK and Dawson City YK.

It took all day to install the new instrument cluster, but that included lots of time for cleaning and polishing the normally hidden parts of the throttle system. What's next on the winter to-do list?

In April Kathy & I are going to ride to San José del Cabo, Mexico (near Cabo San Lucas) and since my Wing has over 215,000 kilometers on it I wanted to have the alternator serviced and the main shock pre-load adjustor checked out. You don't have to take out the gas tank to get these two items off but taking the tank out is a twenty-minute job and, from experience, it will save hours of frustration. Also, a big plus of getting that tank out is that you can do a good clean and inspect the coolant hoses.

After it was out I dropped off the alternator to Western Starter (11655 Eburne Way on Mitchell Island) where they would replace the bearings, bushings and brushes.

Starting last summer I noticed that the pre-load adjustor was not straining until the numbers showed 8 or 9, which meant there was an air bubble in the system. So, with the gas tank out of the way it only took a few minutes to get the rear shock and pre-load adjustor out. I took the unit to RMR Suspension (#19 31550 S. Fraser Way, Abbotsford) for repair. Before going on the ride to Alaska in 2012 I had RMR service my front forks, the rear shock and install a new braded cable on the pre-load adjustor. When I had it out it looked like the pre-load adjustor had leaked a few cc's of fluid.

I was expecting just a quick fluid top-up but the owner (Rod) took the pre-load adjustor off the shock then took it apart and cleaned and serviced it. I am very impressed with RMR's work and even more than satisfied when, an hour later, he handed it back to me and said "There you go. You're on your way." I asked how much and again he said with a smile "You're all done."

Wow, no cost! What an unexpected treat. So let me put in a pat-on-the-back for RMR: They stand behind their work.

Back at home and in no mood for raking leaves I decided to change the coolant. I have written about this before for the GoldNuggets (changing Dan's fluid with the UView 55000 suction tool). I took the opportunity to make a movie of the UView 55000 in action as it collapses the hoses that are normally out of sight under the gas tank. Doing this gets the extra cup of old coolant out of the bike that a 'normal' drain and change would miss. (The movie is okay, but you should see the operation live to really appreciate it.)

After the fluid change I took a few minutes to put in a new air filter. As you all know this is a two-hour job if that is all you are doing. I always change the air filter during my winter maintenance since the time consuming top shelter removal is usually off for other reasons.

A week after I dropped the alternator off I got it back from Western Starter. They did the work and then tested it and cleaned and painted it. It looks and feels like a brand new unit. All for \$100. It installed it with no difficulty, except for a bit of work getting the rubber cover back on the ground bolt. Sometimes the simplest item is the trickiest.

Next the gas tank went back in, and it was easy. In fact it always seems to go in easily when you can put some silicone lubricant on the rub points.

Checking the to-do list and the next item was change tires. For the ride to Mexico I decided to give Metzelers a try and had ordered a set of ME880 Marathon tires which were just waiting to be installed. As part of any tire change I always check the brakes and was pleased to note all brake pads are wearing symmetrically and all have lots of life on them.

With the rear tire off I took a few minutes to change the rear diff oil. Like many I tend to change this oil every time I change the motor oil. Not required, but it's inexpensive and good for the gears.

Of course when you pull the bike apart for the winter break it is easy to clean the bits and pieces before you put them back together. For this reason it takes me many hours to reassemble the bike. The front fenders went on then the top shelter and meter panel. It took several part days of cleaning and polishing and waxing before the bike looked ready for spring.

If I have any winter maintenance regrets it's that no matter how hard I wax and polish I just can NOT get my bike to look as shiny as Patrick's.






