

Now that we all have the bikes licensed and we've probably been out for a nice ride, it's time to think more about the upcoming rallies and rides. First, there is Victoria Days on the May long weekend. (By the time you read this, this event will be over). May 29th is the MFA course as well as the Ride to Live, the ride for Prostate Cancer. BC-D's dinner meeting will be June 1 and BC-A's Memorial Ride is on June 4. The annual Duck Hunt for WA-D takes place on June 11. June 19 brings us BC-A's Father's Day ride as well the Green Heart Ride for BC-C. BC-C's dinner meeting is on June 21. BC-A is having a Triple D ride on June 25 after their Breakfast meeting.

I notice that all these activities are for the lower mainland of BC only. I would like to have a listing from each chapter in the region for rides and events so that everyone is aware of what is happening, and not just in our particular areas. For the 2017 riding season, I want to see a consolidated event calendar done.

On May 14, BC-D held the Memorial Ride/Ice Cream Social. The BC Motorcycle Drill Team came out and did a special performance in honor of Con Williams. They did an awesome job. It meant the world to me. Thanks guys. We raised just under \$1700 for the BC Cancer Society. The money will be presented to them in the next week.

I wish to remind everyone that, if we want them to come to our events, we need to attend their events. It can't be one way only. The support has to go both ways to be successful. This isn't just in the lower mainland, but across the entire region.

Registrations are starting to come in now for the Region J Rally which takes place in late August. If you are planning to go and have not yet registered, please, please do so as soon as possible. It's interesting that most of the registrations received so far are for Alberta members. Come on BC, I know there are many members attending, so let's get those registrations in. Registration info can be found at http://gwrra-regionj.ca/ralliesmain.html. We really need to know how many are coming so that we can do our planning for accommodations and meals. The rally is over on Sunday afternoon and it's only a 2 day ride to Billings for WingDing38. You could do both rallies within 2 weeks depending on where you are from.

Speaking of WingDing 38, the registration number is now 1700. Alberta still leads the pack with largest chapters registered. I don't have the breakdown of chapters/standings as yet. Head office is really excited about the 1700 figure as this is the highest ever for this far in advance of the event. They are projecting that we could meet or beat the record for attendance. It would be fantastic to beat the record as this may convince them that WingDing should be held in the West more often.

Personally, I took the TRC course in early May. What fun! If you have never taken an ARC, TRC (trike), or TC (trailer) courses, you should consider taking them. The difference in comfort level from the morning to the afternoon is amazing.

I look forward to seeing you all at the upcoming events/rides. I can't ride my bike until early July, but I will be there if at all possible. Until that time, keep the rubber side down and the shiny side up! Also, ATGATT!!

Another GL1800 Recall: This time the Airbags Submitted by Ian McAlpine

THE RECALL: Honda (American Honda Motor, Inc.) is recalling certain year 2006-2010 Honda GL1800 (Gold Wing) motorcycles manufactured from February 8th, 2006 to May 14th 2009 originally sold, or ever registered, in Alabama, California, Florida, Hawaii, Louisiana, Mississippi, South Carolina, Texas, Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands (Saipan), and the U.S. Virgin Islands, or "Zone A" above, Honda is recalling certain model year 2006-2008 Honda Gold Wing motorcycles manufactured from May 10th 2007 to May 14th 2009 originally sold or ever registered in Arizona, Arkansas, Delaware, District of Columbia, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia, or "Zone B." Motorcycles not originally sold or ever registered in either Zone A or Zone B are not subject to this safety recall. These motorcycles are equipped with an air bag inflator assembled as part of the air bag module, used as original equipment or replacement equipment. In the event of a crash necessitating deployment of the air bag, these inflators may rupture due to propellant degradation occurring after long-term exposure to absolute humidity and temperature cycling.

WHAT COULD HAPPEN: An inflator rupture may result in metal fragments striking the rider resulting in serious injury or death.

THE FIX: Honda will notify owners, and dealers will replace the air bag module containing the inflator, free of charge. The manufacturer has not yet provided a notification schedule. Owners may also contact Honda Cus-

tomer Service at 1-866-784-1870. Honda's number

for this recall is KA8.

So remember if you do a job on your wing maybe remember to document the installation and take a few pictures, you just might discover a better way of doing the installation and save the next Gold Wing owner some time and grief.

Ride safe everyone.



A Member of a Motorcycle Drill Team



As GWRRA members we take our group riding seriously in hopes of proving to the general public that as motorcyclists we ride in a professional and safe manner. We all have been, at some time, riding in a group and when the lead rider calls for a lane change and everyone moves over as one, you can't tell me you didn't thing that was very cool. You feel pride in getting it right and the general driving public takes notice of our professional attitude. Now take that pride in doing that simple maneuver into a closed space with 4, 6, 8, or more riders and doing multiple maneuvers together so you all look like your riding as one. Believe me it's fun and challenging and best of all you can take all you do on a drill team and use it in the real world, which makes you a better, safer and more confident rider. Now trust is a very important thing on a drill team, and after a time you will begin trusting your fellow drill team members because believe me throwing



around a 900 plus pound motorcycle in very close proximity to another 900 plus pound motorcycle builds trust. I've ridden beside every member of our team and I trust every one of them to ride inches from me and know I'm safe. Sure that doesn't happen overnight but you can't perform on a drill team without gaining trust in your teammates. It's funny, you can't hang around a group of guys or gals who share your love of riding without sharing some down time between practices and performances. We have barbecues and dinners out and any performance we go to that is out of town is an adventure in it's self. When our co-riders join us, which they often do, their support and help makes our adventures even better. You could say part of the fun factor of being on a drill team is not for everyone, but you should really give it a try.

The skills you take away from being on a team will enhance your ability to not only be a safer rider, but a more confident rider. The camaraderie and team fun are just added bonuses. So don't be shy and give it a try because even if a drill team is not your cup of tea, I know you will walk away with a better appreciation of what drill team life is all about.




