See you out there.

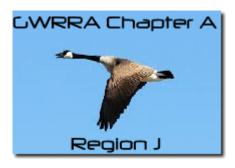

#### The Differences between Ethanol and Gasoline

- 1. A gallon of gasoline provides onethird more energy than a liter of ethanol.
- 2. Blending ethanol and gasoline at a ratio of 85 percent to 15 percent (E85), the blended fuel is nearly thirty percent less powerful than pure gasoline. Ethanol is



similar in acceleration, power, and cruising ability, **but ethanol Kilometers per Liter are less than pure gasoline.** 

- 3. **Ethanol can cause damage** to fuel systems and engines that pure gasoline does not. The most critical problems are water contamination and fuel separation. Ethanol attracts and absorbs water, including water from the air. When the gasoline absorbs enough water, fuel water contamination occurs in the bike's gas tank and that effects engine performance. If the bike sits for a while, fuel separation occurs; this is where the gas and water form layers in the gas tank and if the motor sucks up the water layer into the engine, serious costly, damage happens.
- 4. Ethanol is alcohol, and alcohol causes corrosion in the fuel system. Metal parts rust and plastic parts become deformed or cracked.
- 5. Ethanol is not an ideal fuel additive, and older bikes especially have problems with ethanol fuel.

If ethanol is less efficient than gasoline and can even damage bikes, why is it being blended and sold?

First, gasoline blended with ethanol burns cleaner than pure gasoline. Ethanol cuts a bike's greenhouse emissions. The addition of ethanol to gasoline makes it an "oxygenate" which satisfies the requirements of the Federal legislation known

The second reason is that ethanol comes from corn, and it is big business. Agribusiness is a powerful lobby and with environmentalists siding with them on this issue; the use of ethanol will spread. Recently, the Environmental Protection Agency allowed E15 to join at the fuel pump.

While E10 is widely available, E15 gasoline is only sold in a handful of states and provinces and then in just a few filling station. For instance E15 is sold in Kansas, lowa, Nebraska, and Ontario with as far as I can see only one in BC.

When the Environmental Protection Agency approved E15, it restricted its use and excluded the following from running on it.

- Heavy-duty vehicles
- Boats
- Lawn mowers
- Off-road vehicles
- Motorcycles
- Power equipment

Most cars that were manufactured after 2001 and made to run on "flex fuel" can use E15. All major vehicle manufacturers are exploring voiding warranties on cars using E15 despite engineered for no more than E10 fuel.

In addition, the cost of pure gasoline or *etha-nol-blended gasoline* is about the same,



making the only reason to use ethanol-blended gas an environmental one.

#### Murphy's Motorcycle Laws


- 1. A motorcycle cannot and will not fall over without an audience.

#### How do we develop a new routine?

Well, sometimes this stuff gets invented at a drill team lunch, or dinner with salt and pepper packets laid out in lines, or those little individual creamers in the bowl in front of you. And guys will visualize two lines of bikes and positions of bikes as we investigate something new and clear a big spot of drinks and plates while we "putt putt" the packages of salt and pepper around in a choreographed harmony of fingers, pepper packs, milk creamers, and salt packs...Waitresses think we are off our rockers!! J

Something that works well, are playing cards! They are numbered! ,AND..... the odd line can be one color, and the even line takes the opposite color. Well that's great cause we can now accurately visualize any particular bike within a maneuver and that allows us to know where we are, and where we are riding next.

Some of the best stuff we do actually comes from other teams around the continent.

If you want to see how something "REALLY" looks when it is performed, we just have to do a little scratchin around YouTube and there is a lot of examples of great drill team riding, or even some stunt riding that can give you an idea. Its Ok Carl, we won't be including my daughter Danae to stand on the floor boards of two bikes.... Just

yet!!!!! It's hard to re-invent the wheel because there have been so many riders that have come before all of us! Surely someone must have tried something we haven't thought of!

#### How do we train a new maneuver?

Well that one is a little more complicated! We take an overview of what the maneuver calls for, and start "BIG", I mean as big as we need to! Or in some cases, as "Slow" as



we need to. However, if you came out to one of our practices and watched us near the start of a season, you might get the impression that these guys don't have a clue! In theory, you'd be correct, but more accurately, you're watching the team's first part of the development of a "new" maneuver, and it doesn't always look so cool. De-

pending on what level of skill the maneuver demands, we will sometimes engineer a skill drill to "Target" train a specific skill set! That could be "Vision", "Body Posture", or direct skills like "Turning handlebars" or "Throttle control" etc.....

If for instance, a "Sharp" Counter steer input, is required, then we throw up some cones and go play.

One of the most important things we do is "walking" a routine! Its sometimes easy to just hop on the bike and go throw it around a little, and think that all will be fine, but that can get you into trouble fast, or at the very least you end up wasting time riding when you could be sorting out some of the problems you encounter once you pull a routine apart and do it "silly" slow while walking!! No damage at all when you walk. I don't know a team anywhere that does not walk, walk, and walk a routine, BEFORE attempting to ride it!! That goes for every practice, and every performance. Something we are improving on as a team is a warm up! Or for us the "Walking Warm Up"!

"Practice how you want it to look as if you were performing it". Great place to work on "sharp" head turns! Or turning on the spot the man before you initiated his turn.

We always knew when the softball team was going to play well, and that was when we saw a good warm up. "Bad warm up = poor performance".

Good Warm up = satisfactory, or better, performance!!

Well time to get back to Drill team stuff and re-arrange my salt and pepper packs on the table!!

One of the ironies is that my dad had ridden the same road during World War II on his BSA when he was on leave from his Unit as a Military Motorcycle Policeman. His comment was that I was going way.

too fast and I just left it at that as I would be in that part of the world for several more months. I never did share speeds with him again. My sister and husband on their Honeymoon also shared this road and they were riding a Triumph. An unusual number of coincidences for one family over the years.

When I got back in1968 I bought a small Honda step-through and worked my way up through severall bikes over the next few years. Then I bought a BMW R 600. Back then these were expensive bikes. It rode that for several years and sold it to help pay for my last year of my Teacher training. Same story for many of us,,,came marriage, children, work and no bikes.

Years later in 2004, chance came along to buy the 1982 Wing you see in the attached photo.

Marian thought the bike was a great idea as retirement for us both was approaching quickly. That Wing is still around and when we sold it, it had over 200,000 km's on its well travelled frame. Never once had a mechanical issue. More of an issue: many Dealers we came across in our travels said that they would not service it because of its age. The '82 went to many rallies

including Wing Ding at Billings and at Des Moines and multiple Victoria Days in the USA and Canada.

As for the other Wing in the photo. it is a 2004 we bought in 2010. It has taken us across Canada and to many Rallies and rides in BC and Alberta. My co-rider has added much to our travels over the years; Marian is a great rider. She has a great "sense" about her as she rides, always aware and safety con-

science and a welcome extra set of eyes.

I cannot say enough about the people I meet riding motorcycles; my life has been enriched by all the adventures along this journey. Being a part of GWRRA over the years has been a big part of our time with motorcycles. BC-P and BC-A have been and are fun. We share these adventures with all we meet.




