


30 of The Happiest Facts Ever by Dovas in boredpanda





I was very much involved at the Westwood Race Track in Port Coquitlam as a corner marshal for motorcycle racing, and every race weekend and Wednesday night practices you would find me at one of the many corners directing racers and waving race flags. Life can change though and even though I'd ridden years earlier while stationed at

From there we rode the rest of the trip with everyone else back to Vancouver.
