

## Letter from the Chapter A Directors

### Chapter A Directors September Director's Message

Summer riding season is slowly coming to a close. Many of you have put on a lot of safe miles, which leads me into my discussion about the GWRRA Rider Education Program (REP).

For those of you that are new to GWRRA, the Rider Education Program is a way of tracking your training and commitment to safe riding. The GWRRA

REP is intended to make the motorcycle environment safer by reducing injuries and fatalities and increasing motorcyclist skills and awareness. The REP does not propose to have all the answers. However, our close-working relationship with the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF), as well as additional GWRRA programs and studies, has provided a wealth of information for use in establishing a comprehensive Rider Education Program. Through Commitment, Education and Application, we can reduce our accident rate significantly. Listed below are several benefits of a fully implemented GWRRA Rider Education Program at the Chapter level:

- Increased rider knowledge, Increased rider safety skills, Prevention of accidents, Reduced injuries, Reduced fatalities, Improved general public image of motorcyclists

Enhanced enjoyment of motorcycle riding.

There are 4 levels in the program:

- Level I Safety by Commitment
- Level II Safety by Education
- Level III Safety by Preparedness
- Level IV Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

If you would like to participate in this program, sign-up sheets will be available at the chapter breakfast meetings. There is no cost and patches will be provided by the chapter. By simply signing up, you are already at level one. Level two is completion of an ARC. We hold two or three of these every year – no excuses! Level 3 is even easier – take a Medic First Aid course. There is one coming up on Sept 28 in Chilliwack for those interested.


We hope you all continue to have a safe riding season and as always, keep the shiny side up!



## 50/50 Draw Article—*Submitted by Tracy Gowans (and I didn't win the 50/50)*

Just a year after unveiling an all-new radically-revamped GL1800 Gold Wing and buoyed by public demand, Honda have launched a second variant for much less \$\$\$\$. The new bike will line-up alongside the high-specification Gold Wing Tour and Tour DCT versions and will be available at select dealers. The existing Tour models are both equipped with large top-boxes and heftier price tags to boot, with the new machine acting as more svelte, minimalist and arguably cooler-looking Wing, which replaces the old F6B.

Essentially, the new standard Gold Wing is, like the old F6B, the familiar full-dresser but without rear top box/back-rest (plus built-in speakers) for a more slimmed-down, blacked-out, “bagger” look.

There’s also a matching, shorter screen, it does without a main stand and there’s no DCT option. On the plus side there’s the same super smooth, 1833cc six cylinder power plant giving over 124bhp and 125ftlb of torque, the same sleek aerodynamic bodywork, redesigned chassis and double-wishbone front suspension system.

Unlike some slimmed-down versions of tourers from other brands, you still get all the Wing’s electronic goodies, too. That means ride-by-wire throttle, modes, traction control, keyless ignition, full LED lights plus a fabulous infotainment system that has music, maps, Bluetooth and Apple CarPlay.

In fact, the only things you lose by giving the Tour pack a miss is 50 litres of luggage space, 40 kg of extra weight and a nice back rest for the passenger. But what you gain, by stripping all that back, is a tourer with an extra dash of style; the perfect companion for a weekend away.




